- Creating an influential network of nephrology societies and patients' associations at EU level





EKHA was created in 2007 as a collaborative effort between the International Society of Nephrology (ISN) and the International Federation of Kidney Foundations (IFKF). The European Renal Association (ERA) soon joined the Alliance, followed by the European Kidney Patients' Federation (EKPF), and the European Dialysis and Transplant Nurses Association/European Renal Care Association (EDTNA/ERCA).



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
