

Recommendations to the French Presidency of the EU

EKHA launched a set of recommendations to tackle CKD at EU level, together with its French partners *SFNDT*, *France Rein*, and *Renaloo*.

Calls on the French Presidency to make CKD an EU health priority:

- 1. Prevent CKD or at least delay its progression
- 2. Improve access to existing treatment options and stimulate research to develop more innovative treatments
- 3. Recognise the high vulnerability of patients and their needs in times of pandemic
- 4. Promote green dialysis

Launched on 19 January 2022 in FR and EN.



Follow-up WITH the French Ministry of Health

Workpaper on defining a public Health Policy for the EU

- EKHA worked closely with the French Ministry of Health on the 'Draft Grenoble Declaration': brought forward by French Presidency during meeting of EU Health Ministers on 10 February 2022
- Aims to reinforce the European Health Union & to be signed by all EU Member States
- 3 mentions of Chronic Kidney Disease
 - \rightarrow First time that the impact of CKD is recognised in an official EU document
 - ightarrow Likely to lead to Council recommendations
- [...] <u>chronic kidney disease</u> [...] are all major challenges that demand joint and consistent actions and therefore more useful for Member States.
- [...] The cost of <u>chronic kidney disease</u> is another inadequately documented example of the impact of an ageing population on the EU's economic growth prospects.
- The research and treatment of rare diseases, <u>chronic kidney disease</u>, etc., has the characteristics of European public interest [...].



Defining a public health policy for the Union

This workpaper aims at developing and explaining the progression of the three discussion sessions proposed by the FPEU during the Informal Health Council in Grenoble. This document presents some considerations aiming at supporting our collective reflection including remarks from informal dialogues organised with several European think tanks, notably Bruegel.

Outreach to EU Commissioners Gabriel & Kyriakides

Mariya Gabriel, EU Commissioner for Innovation, Research, Culture, Education and Youth

Letter sent on 25 January 2022, on behalf of Prof. Vanholder

- Request for a meeting to discuss the research priorities of the kidney health community and explore the possibilities for a collaboration to develop innovative CKD treatments.
- Invitation to give keynote speech at European Kidney Forum 2022.

Stella Kyriakides, EU Commissioner for Health and Food Safety

- Letter sent on 27 January 2022, on behalf of Prof. Vanholder
- Express concern over the fact that CKD is not listed amongst the priority diseases of the new EU NCD initiative 'Healthier Together'.
- Provide reasons as to why CKD should be included in the 'Healthier Together' initiative.

European Parliament engagement: COVI Committee

- **COVI Committee**: Special Committee of the European Parliament on the COVID-19 pandemic: 'lessons learned and recommendations for the future'
- Meetings with MEPs who are both members of the COVI Committee and the MEP Group for Kidney health to **discuss how the lessons learned from the COVID-19 crisis could contribute to improving the life of CKD patients.**
- The main goal is for the COVI Committee's report on the lessons learned from the pandemic and recommendations to address the significant challenges and unmet needs in kidney disease management and research.



Outcomes

- Discussions with MEP Liese's team member, who was very receptive to EKHA's messages on the situation of CKD patients in Europe, how the pandemic has shed light on the shortcomings in the delivery of care of CKD and how the lessons learned from could contribute to improving the life of CKD patients.
- The possibility of further meetings to discuss green nephology and MEP Liese's participation in the EKF2023 were considered.
- Meeting allowed to get **further insights on the timeline** in the Parliament, on the priorities of the MEP and have a first contact with the assistant.

Healthier Together Initiative



EU Health Policy Platform

The European Commission has launched in December 2021 the Healthier together – EU non-communicable diseases (NCD) initiative to support EU countries in identifying and implementing effective policies and actions to reduce the burden of major NCDs and improve citizens' health and well-being.

The initiative covers the 2022-2027 period and includes 5 strands:

> health determinants > cardiovascular diseases > diabetes > chronic respiratory diseases >mental health and neurological disorders <</p>

Since CKD is not include in the initiative EKHA engaged into the following actions:

- Pushed for the inclusion of CKD into this new initiative
- Letter signed by Raymond Vanholder to EU Commissioner for Health Stella Kyriakides
- Oral question to the EU Commission tabled by 7 MEPs, and debated in European Parliament Plenary on World Kidney Day
- Emily Petrides, EKPF Representative, conveyed EKHA's messages to Stella Kyriakides, resulting in a suggestion to organise an official meeting between EKHA and EU Commissioner Stella Kyriakides.





EU4HEALTH – CALL FOR PROPOSAL ON CKD

EU4Health programme for a healthier and safer Union #EUBudget #EU4Health

EKHA submitted a project called PREVENTCKD as response to the <u>Call for proposals on prevention of NCDs - other NCDs</u>, by the European Commission, which made mention of kidney disease. The objective of the call is to target NCDs other than those in the five action strands of the 'Healthier Together – EU NCD Initiative' and cancer; for example, kidney diseases, by increasing awareness, sharing knowledge, and building capacity to improve public health, especially at local level.

EKHA constituated a consortium together with:

- The European Kidney Patient Federation (EKPF)
- Eutox (a working group of the European Society of Artificial Organs (ESAO)
- IMEC
- International Society of Nephrology
- RENALOO

Objectives PREVENTCKD project

- Increase awareness on the characteristics, implications and impact of CKD at EU population level and EU policy level
- Preventing CKD from developing;
- Screening population at risk;
- Stimulate health-management for people with kidney disease prior to the stage necessitating kidney replacement therapy, to enhance quality of life, mental health and delay the process of deterioration of the kidney function and to minimize societal cost.

Work Packages

- 1. Data collection on CKD: retrieving new data and updating existing data
- 2. Development and implementation of the Prevention code
- 3. Development and implementation of a transferable albuminuria screening campaign
- 4. Identification and comparison of existing (best)practices in all the above prevention areas, as well as identification of evidence gaps

The project was approved by the EC at the end of 2022 and will run from March 2023 to March 2025

EKHA & EKPF activities on Ukraine

- EKHA EKPF open letter to the European Commission & journal article
 - Aim:
 - Alert EU policy makers and the public on the dire situation of CKD patients in Ukraine and neighboring countries
 - > Propose short and long-term solutions to protect CKD patients in time of war
 - Outcomes:
 - High engagement on social media
 - > Appreciation received from Stella Kyriakides' cabinet and DG SANTE
- EKHA participation to the European Commission stakeholder group on supporting Ukraine
 - EKHA participated in two meetings and raise CKD patients' needs on the ground and surrounding countries

Meeting with the EuropanCommission on Ukraine

- On 8 June 2022, **EKHA, EKPF, and ERA** met with DG SANTE representatives to discuss about the situation of kidney patients in Ukraine
- EKHA, EKPF and ERA presented the challenges encountered by kidney patients on the ground, highlighted the work of the three organisations so far, in particular the Renal Disaster Relief Taskforce and proposed forward-looking solutions on the short and long term.

INFORMATION PROVIDED BY THE COMMISSION

- DG Santé is **adjusting its workplan** to the situation in Ukraine
- EC cannot act inside Ukraine, so it has **set up a system of medical evacuation** to transport patients from the country to the EU (transplant patients qualify for this)
- All requests for medicines and other needs must be addressed by the Ukrainian Ministry of Health to the <u>Emergency Response Coordination Centre</u> from DG ECHO, which then coordinates with Member States

Outcomes

- The Commission is willing to receive information from the RDRT
- They can facilitate a meeting with DG Research
- Very willing to keep the dialogue open with EKHA, EKPF and ERA on Ukraine and kidney health in general







NON-COMMUNICABLE DISEASES

NO KIDNEYING AROUND ON CKD: Health Commissioner Stella Kyriakides addressed the European Parliament on Thursday to talk about chronic kidney disease (CKD), a condition which affects as many as one in 10 Europeans. It's a topic that has only gained prominence due to how vulnerable patients with CKD are to the coronavirus.

Taking action: The Commission isn't sitting on its hands, said Kyriakides. Kidney disease is squarely in DG SANTE's cross-hairs through its new noncommunicable disease program "Healthier Together." The program targets cardiovascular disease and diabetes — both of which contribute to the prevalence of CKD.

In the works: Meanwhile, the health commissioner said, the 2020 Horizon Europe research programs includes 40 projects directly addressing CKD backed by €64 million with another 24 projects related to kidney transplants with a total of €47 million of funding — while the 2021 work program includes a call for the development of portable dialysis.

A standalone program? Finnish MEP Sirpa Pietikäinen (European People's Party group) said that the Commission should consider putting CKD at the same level as its other standalone programs like in cardiovascular disease. "Kidney disease is a silent killer. We do not raise it as a big issue at our member state level," she said.



In 2022 an expert panel (consisting of nephrologist, economists and patients) formulated the following policy actions with regards to treatment of rare kidney diseases. Whitepaper and scientific article will be published in 2023.

- Raise awareness on CKD and RKD amongst policymakers and the general population
- Develop guidelines specific to RKD

- Advance genome and biomarker research

Factors affecting rare kidney diseases

Management

- Develop clinical guidelines specific to RKD
- Improve access to innovative therapies
- Design and implement RKD registries
- Conduct PROM-oriented studies
- Launch multi-disciplinary teams with a focus on RKD

Therapeutic innovation

- Allocate R&D funds to RKD
- Generate evidence to expand understanding of RKD
- Identify and validate surrogate endpoints
- Conduct large scale multicentric studies
- Increase acceptance of alternative statistical methods

Round table: ways to enhance QoL in dialysis care – hybrid

Key findings panel:

- There is an urgent need to listen to and empathize with patients.
- Both patients and healthcare professionals should receive proper education on CKD and dialysis.
- Patients should play a more active role in advocating for the improvement of their QoL and should speak with one voice.
- Calling on the European Union and Member States to work together to develop a patient-centered approach to dialysis care.

Key findings audience:

- **Patient advocacy** is instrumental in improving kidney care. As such, patients must be included in advocacy efforts to raise awareness of their needs.
- **Complete psychosocial care**, which gives access to social workers and psychologists, also con- tributes to achieving a higher QoL. Family members and caretakers also need to be involved in the conversation.
- A patient-centric approach puts patients in control over aspects that influence their OoL. A pa- tient-centric approach takes patients' needs, desires and education into account.
- There is a need to **improve patients' health literacy**. Patients' education must be tailored to their perspective, and start at the onset of their disease (pre-dialysis).






Where science meets advocacy – EKHA projects 2023

- PREVENTCKD: to enhance CKD screening, data on prevalence and incidende, best practises and the creation of a CKD prevention code. The project is funded by the EC and supported by AstraZeneca, in collaboration with members of EKHA working group 1 and the following consortium partners:
 - EKPF EUTOX IMEC ISN RENALOO
- 2. Exploration of a self management tool for people living with CKD (funded by Baxter) in collaboration with members of EKHA working group 2.
- **3.** Facilitate Home Haemodialysis care for chronic dialysis patients in Europe (funded by Mozarc) in collaboration of a working group constructed of experts in the nephrology field (nephrologist, nurses and patient).
- 4. Establishment of an international consortium for ground breaking innovation in collaboration with:
 - Patient organisations EKPF and AAKP;

 - Members of EKHA working group 3






EKHA overall advocacy achievements

Connecting the network (1)

Q: How can we further improve our collaboration?

- Involve more patients, take their limitations into account (low energy for travelling/long meetings, covid risks)
- Learn more about other members' activities, strategies, national situations, etc.
- More shared projects and more interactive (virtual) meetings / catch up talks
- Professional support to the nephrology society
- To do this kind of questionnaires regularly. Specifically questions number 2 and 3 on national political issues and how EKHA can support.
- Short regular exchange about the state of the CKD situation in the individual countries.

Connecting the network (2)

Q: What should be – to your opinion – the highest priority for EKHA to work on?

- The contact and working with the EU policymakers is unique for EKHA. So this should be the main focus of EKHA. Information has to flow in both directions.
- EKHA should stress the importance of kidney disease in public health and convince lawmakers to increase funding of measures that confer renal protection
- Bringing CKD into the "European consciousness". Support innovations in renal replacement therapy with all our Equal access to all modalities of RRT in all countries (i.e. advocate for approximately equal reimbursement in countries).
- Continue to get kidney failure on the agenda of EU to stop increasing CKD (failure/death cause) address issues (like covid, shortage of medication, quality of care, prevention)
- Clear information on healthy life style by EU/WHO
- Increasing opportunities to get EU funds for joint projects
- To inform governments and people for chronic Kidney disease and how to prevent it
- Organ transplantation and CKD prevention.
- The most urgent task should be the decrease of the incidence of CKD by education of the whole society from the medical staff to the politicians.

Connecting the network (3)

Q: How can we better share knowledge and activities of the network?

- The meeting in Milan was excellent (the idea and the execution). This should be repeated.
- Newsletters, mails, social media, meetings, everything is already there.
- A regular external newsletter would be a great idea, to be distributed to the Brussels health bubble and all other concerned / interested stakeholders. It could also be an opportunity to talk more about EKHA's members activities.
- The Prevent CKD project analogue to EU Cancer Code can make a website in 24 languages of EU (or more) with scientific validation/actualisation, for stage 1/2/3. Most kidney associations are oriented to Stage 4/5. Stage 1/2/3 is a much broader group of (future) patients.
- Webinars to share knowledge on national and EU projects (e.g. sharing of best practises)
- Regular meetings for discussions
- Install a virtual platform

Connecting the network (4)

Q: Other suggestions, ideas, questions?

- Show, how the representation of nephrologists, patients, nurses, foundations, industry and providers works. In Germany, we have laws, which prohibits the cooperation of all these groups at all time. Perhaps, there is a chance for an European law, which overuses these national laws.
- Promote "green nephrology" less water, less electricity, lower CO2 footprint.
- More information on EU health policy news would be very welcome.
- Prepare a tv spot that can be distributed to all the members and with collaboration of all them and the possibility to present it for one month in all the countries the same period (with additional fundraising)
- Webinars may help
