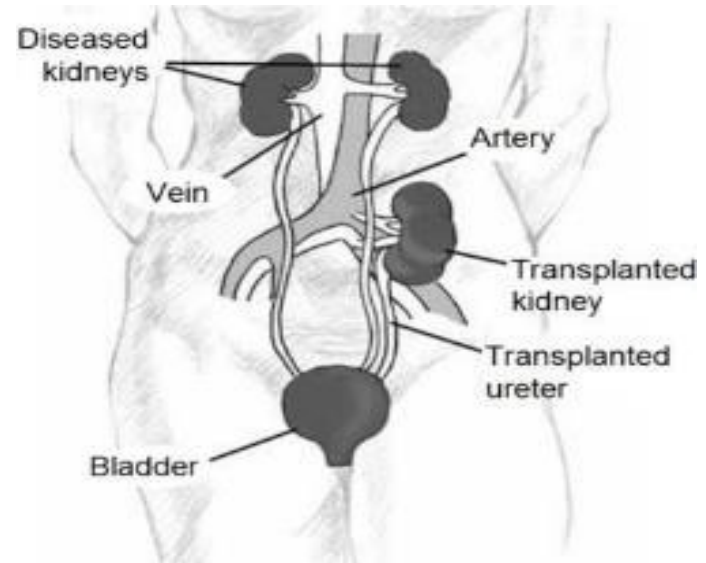

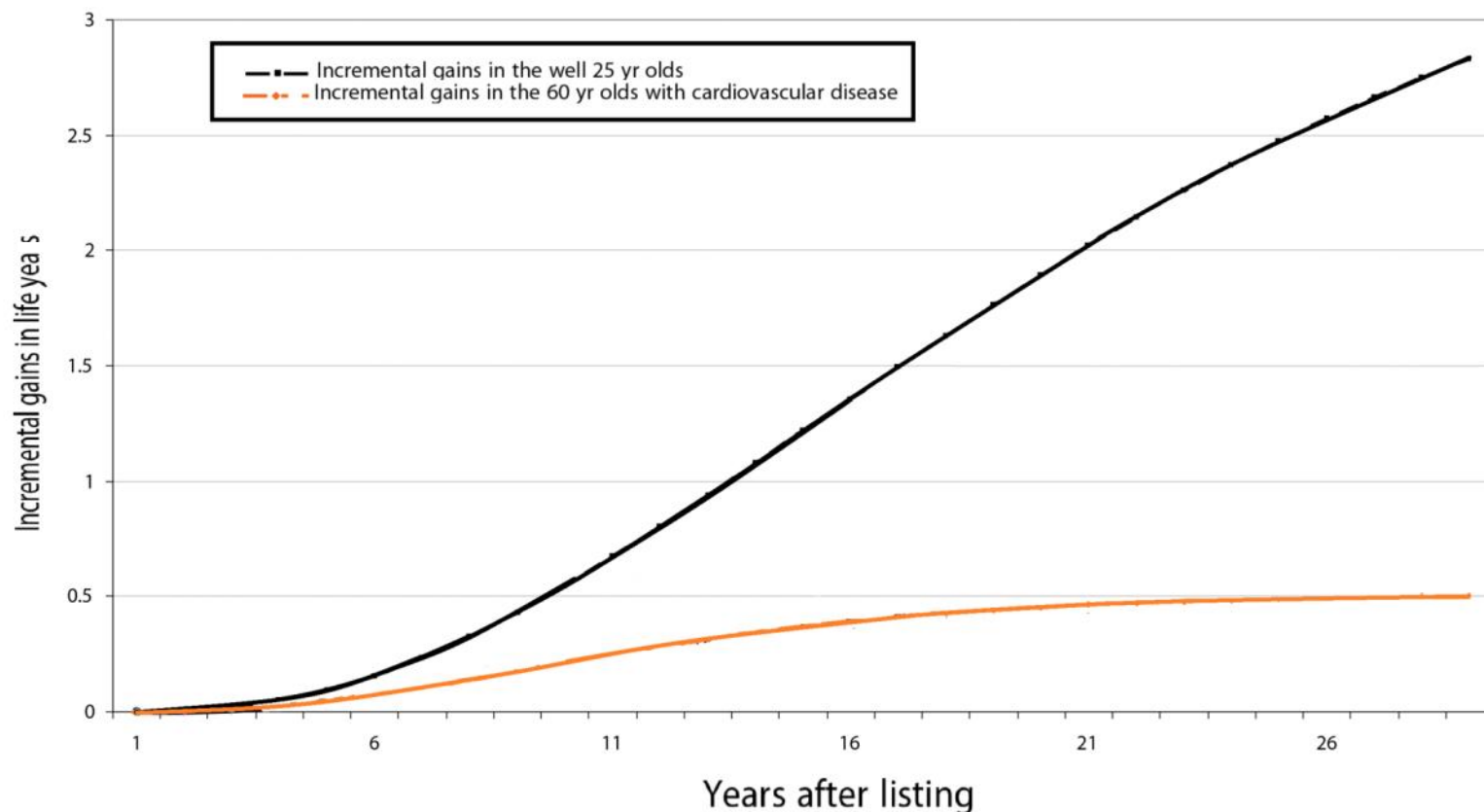

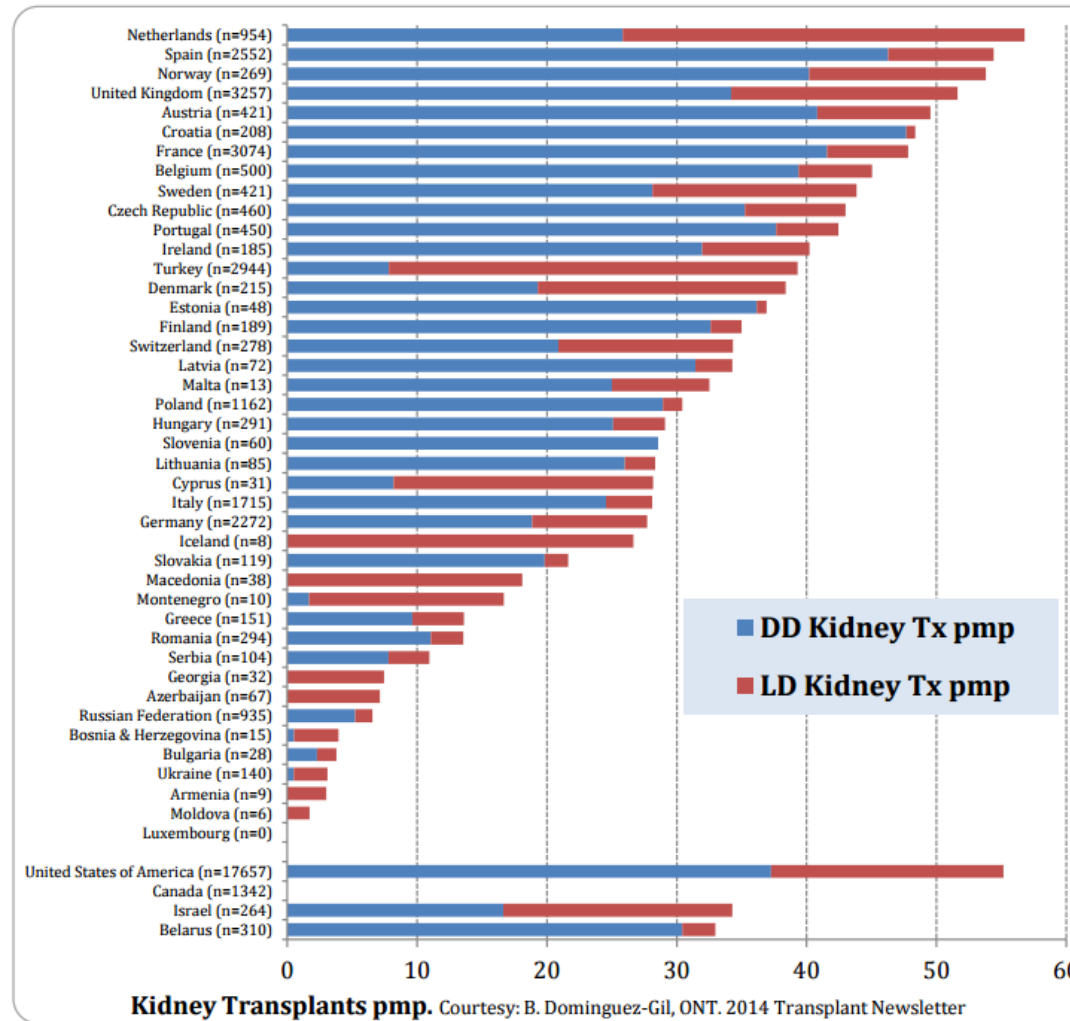

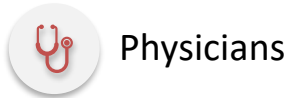
Joint Statement—Main Topics
