









Heart transplant rates for Europe, Australia and the USA, 2017

England

From spring 2020, all adults in England will be considered to have agreed to be an organ donor when they die unless they have recorded a decision not to donate or are in one of the excluded groups.

Wales

The legislation for Wales is 'deemed consent'. This means that if you haven't registered an organ and tissue donation decision, you will be considered to have no objection to becoming a donor.

Scotland

The current legislation for Scotland is to opt in to organ and tissue donation. However, a bill including provision for a 'deemed authorisation system' has been put forward for consideration by the Scottish Parliament.

The current legislation for Northern Ireland is to opt in to organ and tissue donation. In 2016 the Northern Ireland Assembly decided not to proceed with any changes to the basis of consent for organ donation.





High Impact: In 5 years we could see, per annum:


- ~600 more donors than currently & ~1600 more transplants:

- 50-100 pancreas, heart, lung














Deceased and living donor transplants










Adult living donor kidney transplants






Increase in altruistic and paired exchange donor transplants


Median waiting time to adult kidney transplant
